## **Mission Statement:**

**The Centre Network for Discipleship Training Schools** has been established to maintain and enhance excellence in DTS programs worldwide in accordance with the DTS purpose and curriculum guidelines set by the International Leadership of Youth With A Mission and the University of the Nations. The Centre staff seeks to serve DTS leadership by providing encouragement, support and expertise in program, leadership and resource development. The Centre facilitates the networking of personnel and resources among all DTS and Field Assignment/Outreach locations and the seven colleges/Centres of the University. It also aids in stimulating the multiplication of new DTS's in strategic locations of the world.

## **The goals of the DTS Centre Network are as follows.**

- A. **Partnering within YWAM International:** to develop a relational network of DTS leaders/staff within each region that is also connected to the global DTS world and with all streams of YWAM's Family of Ministries.
- B. **Programme Development:** to aid in the design of DTS programs in accordance with the DTS purpose and curriculum guidelines set by the International Leadership of YWAM/UofN.
- C. **Leadership Development:** to facilitate DTS leadership and staff development in response to requests and identified needs.
- D. **Educational Resource Development:** to create resources that aid in the training of DTS staff or in implementing an aspect of the Curriculum in the DTS and to facilitate the distribution of new and existing resources to the DTS world.
- E. **Programme Monitoring:** to receive, track and review course registration documentation for each DTS programme.
- F. **Strategic Multiplication:** to promote the pioneering of new DTS's and Field Assignment/Outreaches in the ten major language groups and the least evangelized nations of the world.

# INTRODUCTION:

## What do we want in or as a result of the DTS world by the year 2005?

International DTS Centre Team:

- 25 Regional DTS Centre teams functioning to serve each of the 25 YWAM regions.
2. "Specialists" who serve the DTS world according to a category (i.e. learning styles, culture, world view, discipleship, outreach)
3. "Generalists" who serve the DTS world in a variety of ways.
  4. Several "Focused teams" to serve a specific aspect of the DTS. (outreach, learning styles etc.)
  5. An IDTSC Team of 50 plus creating opportunity for synergy among the (1) regional teams, (2) specialists and (3) generalists and (4) focused teams.
  6. Effective interface of International DTS Centre team members with YWAM geographic structures.
  7. YWAM as a whole understands the purpose of the DTS .

Network:

8. A global network established: DTS to DTS and DTS to other YWAM ministries.
9. A regional network of DTS staff established in each region/field .

Quality:

10. DTS graduates with a growing understanding of the breadth and depth of God's character and ways.
  11. DTS graduates who are becoming more like Jesus in the way they relate to God and people.
  12. DTS graduates who listen to God and are committed to live whole heartedly for God and for His kingdom. (including impacting peoples, nations, spheres of society)
  13. DTS graduates who love the Scripture, think for themselves and know what they believe.
  14. DTS graduates with emerging lifestyles of worship, intercession and spiritual warfare.
  15. DTS graduates who can share the Gospel with the lost and have a life long commitment to do so.
  16. Base leadership teams who are regularly evaluating the quality of their DTS staff and program.
  17. A significant increase of DTS staff called to serve DTS long term.
  18. DTS staff who are equipped and supported through a variety of people and resources.
  19. Effective leading of DTS that suits learning styles.
  20. DTS staff who disciple and release people.
  21. Outreach leaders and teams.
  23. Lasting fruit as a result of the most DTS outreach teams.

24. Mono-cultural schools becoming more multi-cultural.

- 25. Clarified Curriculum Document made available to the DTS world.
- 26. A DTS teams sent out with a conviction that God is actively guiding them.

## Projected IDTSC Leadership Team Development:

The International DTS Centre (IDTSC) Leadership Team will expand to 50+ people who are committed to giving at least 40% of their working year to serve the DTS world, outside of their local base. Each team member will personally contribute to the purpose and goals of the IDSC according to their own unique gifts and calling. Each team member makes a minimum two year commitment and agrees to attend the strategic annual meeting of the IDTSC Leadership Team. Each member is also responsible to write their own job description based on their projected activity within the framework of the 6 goals of the International DTS Centre. Job descriptions are reviewed annually.

The International DTS Centre Leadership Team is made up of:

1. Coordinators of YWAM Field or Regional DTS Centre Teams
2. Coordinators of focused teams
3. Specialist with a specific expertise helpful to DTS staff
4. Generalists with a wide range of experiences and skills helpful to DTS staff

Field or Regional DTS Centre teams will be created to meet the needs of the DTSs in the field/region of focus. Our goal is that the DTS field or regional teams emerge in partnership with YWAM geographic structures.

We are progressing well with the initial stages of development, particularly in some parts of the world. Our strategy has been to have senior members of the IDTSC Leadership Team take responsibility to fulfill a so called "midwife" role in a field/region until a longer term team coordinator emerges. This "midwifing process" initially involves travel to key events and places in a region in order to lay a relational foundation for future development. The next stage is for a 5-7 day DTS Foundational Staff and Leadership

Training Workshop to be made available to that region initially as soon as possible, and then subsequently one within every 2 year period. One of several specific goals of initially gathering the DTS staff to a workshop context is to begin to identify DTS leaders within the region who are called and gifted as needed to eventually serve in a formal way with either the International/Field/Regional DTS Centre Team.

Our leadership structure and process are emerging but this is the present picture: Maureen has "midwife" responsibility for the Americas (5 regions) and Europe (4 regions). Pete Thompson has "midwife" responsibility for Africa (including North Africa, 5 regions). He reports to Maureen.

Patti Lee has "midwife" responsibility for South & Central Asia Field (6 Regions) and Asia & Pacific Field (4 regions). Patti reports to Maureen. Maureen and Patti share together the "midwife" responsibility for the Middle East (1 region).

Our present state of development is as follows:

**1. The Americas Field:**

a. North America Region (NA): In May of 2001 Maureen and Patti attended the NALC to network with YWAM North American's Regional, Area and Base Leaders and to meet specifically with the DTS staff present at the conference. After consulting with the DTS staff/leaders, 2 Foundational DTS Workshops were scheduled for North America (NA) in 2002 which Maureen will lead. Maureen is also working together with Pete Ilyin and other NA leaders with the aim of having a NA Regional DTS Centre by April 2003.

1. History:

(1) 1993 Foundational DTS Workshops held for North America, lead by Darlene, Maureen, Patti and Matt Rawlins in collaboration with Gordy Macdonald and the Lakeside Montana base in which there were 64 participants representing 17 DTS/CDTS schools .

(2) 1998 Foundational DTS Workshop lead by Maureen and Patti in collaboration with Randy Thomas, the USA DTS Coordinator at the time, and others from the Trinidad, Co. base.

(3) 1999 U of N International Workshop with a DTS Training Track included which was lead by the IDTSC Leadership Team.

b. Central America and Carribean Region: Maureen, Patti and Aimee will present a DTS Workshop in the context of the LTS in Barbados where they expect to have 130 or more students from the Caribbean, Mexico, Central and South America. At that time, Maureen will spend time in the LTS context networking with Regional and National Directors and other leaders from the region. By the end of April 2002 Maureen will identify further steps to be taken.

1. History: 1993 Foundational DTS Workshop lead by Darlene Cunningham, Maureen, Patti and Matt Rawlins for the CAC Region in 1993 in collaboration with Rick Allegretto, the CAC Regional Director, with 84 participants representing 24 DTS/CDTS schools in 14 nations.

c. South America (3 Regions): Maureen, Patti and Pete attended the South American Staff Conference in Ecuador in May 2000 to network and consult with YWAM Regional and National Directors and to specifically meet with the DTS Staff and Leaders present at the conference. Maureen, Patti and Aimee will present a DTS Workshop in the context of the 2002 LTS in Barbados where they expect to have 130 or more students from the Caribbean, Mexico, Central and South America. Maureen is saving a large block of time in 2003 for South America. Maureen plans to talk with South American leaders in GLT in Nairobi, August 2001.

1. History:

(1) During the combination of the two training opportunities mentioned below there were 224 DTS/CDTS participants representing 15 schools in 8 different nations.

(a) 1992 Loren and Darlene Cunningham traveled extensively in the Southern Cone with David Hamilton during which time they held multiple gatherings of DTS and other school leaders for times of input and training.

(b) 1993 the U of N International Workshop was in Manaus, Brazil and included a 4 day DTS training track lead by Maureen and Patti.

(2) Denise Oliveria from Brazil has been giving on going input and training specifically to the many DTS's in Brazil which is now a YWAM Region within South America.

## 2. Europe and Middle East Field:

a. Europe Sub Field (4 Regions): Cassie Williams has taken responsibility for the development of both a European DTS Centre Team and regional teams for the 4 European regions. She reports to Maureen. Cassie is actively involved in European staff and leadership meetings. Several people from the IDTSC team are involved with Europe at this point including: Wolfgang Jani (Bulgaria), Lisa Whitaker (Sarajevo), Ron and Bonny Theisen (Budapest), Sue Pratt (UK), Holger and Jilly Schein. Cassie will be leading a Foundational DTS Workshop for European DTSS in July 2001 in Amsterdam, Netherlands. Lisa will be leading a Foundational DTS Workshop in Romania for Central Europe in the fall of 2001 as well. Cassie will soon be ready to add more to the European DTS Centre Team. Cassie maintains a good working connection to the YWAM's European Director, Jeff Fountain.

1. History:

(1) 1982 onward - Maureen has been serving, leading and networking within Europe.

(2) 1988 Loren and Darlene Cunningham held the first Uof N DTS Training Workshop in Lausanne Switzerland with about 50 in attendance.

(3) 1993 a Foundational DTS Workshop was held for all of Europe in Harpenden, England and was lead by Darlene, Maureen and Patti with 102 in attendance representing

33 DTS/CDTS schools in 21 nations.

- (4) 1995 a European Collaborative DTS Outreach was lead by Maureen, Lisa and Patti with 150 students and staff from 7 DTSS. They came together in Budapest, Hungary and then went out on outreach in 13 outreach teams focused on the Balkans, Turkey and Central Asia.
- (5) 1996 Martha McComb planted a church in Serbia through a DTS outreach team and thus began to pioneer the new work of YWAM in Serbia.
- (6) 1996 a Foundational DTS Workshop was presented by Darlene, Edwin Filles, and Sue Pratt in Burtigy, Switzerland for the French Speaking world with about 40 participants.
- (7) 1996 a DTS Workshop was presented in the context of the LTS by Maureen and Patti in Budapest, Hungary in collaboration with Darlene Cunningham.
- (8) 1997 the U of N International Workshop with a DTS Training Track lead by Darlene, Maureen and Patti was presented in Restenas, Sweden.
- (9) 1998 was the pioneering of the first DTS in Serbia with 11 students from 8 nations lead by Chris and Linda Wormald and Martha McComb.
- (10) 1998 a Central European Collborative Outreach was lead by Maureen and others in the Balkan Leadership Team with a focused outreach on the Balkans.
- (11) 1998 an International DTS Consultation lead by the the IDTSC team was held in Lausanne, Switzerland with about 60 in attendance.
- (12) 1999 a Foundational DTS Workshop lead by Wolfgang, Cassie and Lisa was held in the Ukraine for the Eastern European Region DTSSs with about 60 in attendance.
- (13) 1999 'The Euro-Gathering' The IDTSC Leadership Team invited 'The Factory' ministry in England to come to Budapest to hold a "Gathering" of DTS students and staff from all over Europe. Aimee and Cassie were a part of the leadership team for the "Euro - Gathering".
- (14) 1999 'Serbia Aid Project' lead by Martha McComb.
- (15) 1999 'Sarajevo Prayer Summit' where the IDTSC collaborated with the European Leadership of YWAM to host a 'Prayer Summit' in Sarajevo, Bosnia.
- (16) 1999 Pioneering of the first DTS in Bosnia was four weeks later and lead by Lisa Whitaker.
- (17) 2001 Lisa Whitaker and BeeJay Carter are leading the second DTS in Sarajevo.

b. Middle East Region: Patti and Maureen attended the Middle East staff conference in Jan. 2001 to network with leaders. They are in dialogue with Mounir Boctor and the MELT to determine the next steps. The MELT is planning a collaborative DTS outreach in the Middle East Region for 2002.

1. History: 1997 a Collaborative Outreach with 50 young people from 5 different schools that came together in the Galilee of Israel under the leadership of Arthur Carlson, Michael Niebur and Sarah Lanier for a Joint Field Assignment.

3. Africa Field: (5 regions) Pete, Maureen, Patti, Sue and Aimee attended the Africa Leadership and Prayer Summit in Feb 2001 and gathered together the DTS staff and leaders present at the Summitt. Pete has the responsibility to further develop an African Field DTS Centre as well as Regional DTS Centres. Pete reports to Maureen. There are

several initiatives planned for Africa including a 4 day DTS Workshop in each region North, South, East and West in the context of the U of N International Workshop in Sept. 2001. An 3 week extended Foundational DTS Workshop is scheduled for Nov/Dec 2001. Key DTS leaders from Africa will participate in that extended workshop and our hope is that some will formally link with the African Field or Regional DTS Centre. Another initiative in process is a Foundational DTS Workshop in 2002 for the West Africa Region for which Sue Pratt would take a leading role and collaborate with the regional and national leadership of West Africa. That workshop would focus on other parts of the French Speaking peoples of Africa. Pete is also a member of the YWAM's Southern Africa Leadership team, and is now also a member of the Africa Leadership Team as well, representing the IDTSC, as such he relates also to Kobus, John and Iain.

a. History:

1. 1992 a DTS Leaders Training Track in the context of the LTS in Nairobi, Kenya lead by Darlene and Patti in collaboration with Arne Peterson, the East Africa Regional Director. The workshop was in English and French with about about 107 leaders from all over Africa and beyond representing 35 DTS/CDTS Schools in 25 nations.
2. 1997 a Collaborative DTS Outreach lead by Edwin Filles in Maritius and the Indian Ocean Islands with about 70 participants from 5 DTS/CDTS schools.
3. 1998 DTS Leaders Training Track in the LTS lead by Maureen, Pete and Patti plus others of the IDTSC team in Worcester, South Africa with some 160 or more participants in collaboration with Darlene Cunningham.
4. 1999 a DTS Leaders Training Track lead by Pete Thompson in Togo with in the context of the West Africa U of N Workshop in collaboration with David Hamilton and the West Africa leadership with some 102 participants representing every training base in West Africa.
5. 1999 a Collaborative DTS Outreach lead by Edwin, Emele and Sue with 4 or 5 DTS Schools coming in to Madagascar and the Indian Ocean Islands.
6. 1999 a DTS Leaders Workshop lead by David Hamilton for DTS/CDTS in Africa at Harare, Zimbabwe with 120 participants representing 13 DTS/CDTS school.
7. 2000 a DTS Collaborative Outreach lead by Edwin and Emele in Mauritius and the Indian Ocean Islands.
8. 2000 a DTS Leaders Training Track lead by Pete and Emele in the context of the East Africa Regional Staff Conference in Uganda in collaboration with John Kisamwa, the Regional Director.

**4. Central and South Asia Field:**

a. Central Asia: Several members of the International DTS Centre team have had on going involvement with DTS in Central Asia. (Aimee Honchen, Lisa Whitaker, Wolfgang Jani). In November 2002 Central Asia's DTS staff and leaders will be invited to the South and Central Asia DTS Training Program in India s called "Equipping Leaders Today". That will begin to link them relationally with Patti and Elena. (See below)

1. History:

(1) In 1998 a Biblical Studies Course lead by Maureen on the Life and Ministry of the Apostle Paul in Ephesus, Turkey with 5 students.

(2) In 1999 a Biblical Studies Course lead by Maureen, Reate and Patti on the Life and Ministry of the Apostle Paul in Ephesus, Turkey with 16 students.

b. South Asia (5 regions): Elena Ciobo has taken responsibility to further the development of a DTS Centre Regional Teams in South Asia. Elena reports to Patti. Most likely a South Asia Field Centre will emerge first before more focused Regional Centres. Elena, Patti, Maureen and three other members of the IDTSC team ran a 3 week Foundational DTS Workshop in India in Nov. 2000 in cooperation with Steve and Elizabeth Cochrane. This laid the foundation for Elena to emerge with this responsibility in the South Asia Field. Elena, having also networked with Joshua as the West/Central India Regional Director, attended the West & Central India Sub Continent staff conference in May 2001. She will be running an extended DTS staff training school in India in Nov/Dec 2002 called "Equipping Leaders Today". She has already involved DTS leaders working in all of these regions in the process of defining the needs and in making an appropriate training response.. Patti and Elena are working closely with Steve and Elizabeth Cochrane and YWAM Regional Directors in South Asia and hope to have identified key leaders to be a part of the Field/Regional DTS Centre by the end of 2002.

1. History: India and Bangladesh In July 1998 Maureen, Patti and Cassie lead a 3 day DTS training workshop in Calcutta India for all India and Bangladesh DTS Staff with 60 participants representing 14 DTS/CDTS schools.

2. History: Nepal - 1998 A Foundational DTS Workshop lead by Maureen, Patti and Cassie for Nepal's DTS Staff /Leaders in collaboration with Lee Baker the U of N Liaison for Nepal. There were 30 participants representing all 5 DTSS in Nepal.

**5. Asia and Pacific Field:**

a. Asia: (3 Regions) Patti and Maureen attended the Asia & Pacific staff conference in May 2001 to network with leaders. Patti has a long history of leadership in Asia starting back in 1979. After consultation with DTS staff/leaders in the P & A conference, two Foundational DTS Workshops have been scheduled in 2002 for Asia, one in East Asia and in the other in Philippines. Patti will give leadership to these workshops and ask others to join her in a leadership team. Patti has been in dialogue with Tom Hallas the YWAM Field Director over the last many years in addition to several Regional and National leaders in Asia. In the past 2 years Patti has been in communication with Rob Westwood, the Australia DTS Coordinator working in Melbourne, Australia and as of this year Rob has officially joined the IDTSC Leadership Team. She has also been in contact with Mark Ng, the Training Director for South East Asia working in Singapore and Mark states that he anticipates joining the team sometime in 2002. Each of these people have a long history of DTS leadership and expertise in Leadership Training and Development with which they will serve the DTSS in the Asia and Australia. Patti will

continue to dialogue with YWAM Field and Regional leaders as regional DTS Centres develop.

1. History: East Asia -

(1) 1993 a DTS Leaders Training Track lead by Darlene and Patti in the context of the East Asia Region Staff Conference in collaboration with Gary Stephens as the Regional Director in which there were 40 participants representing 13 schools in 7 nations.

(2) 1997 the U of N International Workshop with a DTS Training Track lead by Maureen and Patti with some 200 people present in Korea.

2. History: Australia/New Zealand - 1993 a Foundational DTS Workshop lead by Darlene, Patti and Allana Hiha for all DTSS in Australia at the Newcastle YWAM base in collaboration with Rob Westwood the Australia National DTS Coordinator and Tom Hallas, the YWAM National Director. There were 60 participants representing 15 schools.

3. History: SE Asia - 2000 A DTS Workshop lead by Patti and David Hamilton in Bali, Indonesia for all of the DTSS nationally in collaboration with David Cole, the SE Asia Regional Director, Mark Ng the SE Asia Region Training Director and the Indonesia National Leadership. There were 60-70 participants representing 18 or more DTS locations in the nation.

b. Pacific Region: Most of the International DTS Centre Team were present for the DTS Centre Workshop presented to 170 people in the context of the LTS in New Zealand in Jan 2000 in collaboration with Darlene Cunningham. In addition Patti called together the DTS Leaders and Staff from the Pacific to network, assess needs and begin looking at how to meet some of those needs among DTSS. Emele Kila, from Fiji, a member of our IDTSC team is helping to make connections with the Pacific Region as well. Patti has been in dialogue with several leaders in the Pacific over the last 18 months including Mark Parker, the Training Director for New Zealand; Merewalesi Quari, Prayer and Worship Centre Coordinator for New Zealand; and Gwen Berquist, CDTS Hawaii. Each of these people have leadership expertise that serve the DTSS in the Pacific and beyond the Pacific into other parts of Asia as well. The aim is for all of the persons above to very soon be formally linked with the International DTS Centre team. Patti has been in dialogue with both the outgoing and incoming Pacific Regional Directors and will continue to dialogue with YWAM Field and Regional leaders as regional DTS Centres develop. Emele will run a DTS Workshop as a follow up specifically for the Pacific Region attendees to the U of N International Workshop in the East Africa site location following the Int. Workshop time.

1. History: 1994 a DTS Workshop in the context of the LTS lead by Darlene and Patti in Tonga for the Pacific Region in which there were 89 participants representing 14 DTS/CDTS schools in 11 nations.

## Snapshot Reports

### I. Partnering with YWAM International:

**A. Collaborative Outreaches:**

**1. *Snapshot Reports: Mauritius & Indian Ocean Islands 2000 by Edwin Filles***  
DTS teams from different bases and schools came together around the purpose of impacting the nation/region and to spearhead the pioneering of new YWAM ministries.

**B. Collaborative Events:**

**1. *Snapshot Report: 'DTS Link' - Sjellebro, Denmark 2000* by *Cassie Williams*** This collaborative DTS lecture phase event drew together DTS staff and student teams from the Denmark, Lausanne, Amsterdam, Hurlach and Harpenden bases. Approximately 70-80 people attended. One aim was to gain a better understanding of the nature of the apostolic calling and ministry in and through the DTS. There was a significant worship and intercession focus, which was a part of the spiritual impartation of the week. Specifically time was spent seeking God over the nations to which the outreach teams would be going. A further aim of the week was to see European DTS's further linked across the continent both relationally and in further collaborations. An outcome of this week is that some schools have now planned further such events.

**2. *Snapshot Report: 'The Hook UP' Almaty, Kazakstan 2001* by *Aimee Honchen*** Bringing the DTS's from Hawaii, Central Asia, and the Central Asian Mobile DTS, coming together for a few weeks to share lectures, worship, intercession group projects etc. in Almaty Kazakstan. Something powerful happens when a larger diverse group comes together from different regions, where we can see exchange happen within the different DTS's. A certain synergy can happen, there is a wider variety of culture for us to explore and to learn in, and an environment is created where see God through different eyes. A place is also as created to partner in, see the spirit of God move in and through, and see a deposit to one another... I'm believing The International Hookup of DTS's in Central Asia will be a time none of us ever forget!

**3. *Snapshot Report: "That Thing" - Almaty, Kazakstan 2001* by *Aimee Honchen*** The purpose of the event is to gather overseas outreach teams from YWAM and Local Churches into Central Asia for a time of fresh vision, worship, cultural orientation and prayer for the region. There will definitely be an emphasis on mobilizing youth, but 'That Thing' is not exclusive to any particular age category. At present we are expecting over 10 teams from the Islands, USA, Central Asia, Hawaii, and Europe. I would estimate over 20 nationalities. We decided to call the gathering 'That Thing' because we feel like it's bigger than just an event. We believe it is a prophetic statement and will be an apostolic thrust of what God is wanting to do in Central Asia: energizing young people with His power to transform the nations.

**C. Networking in geographical structures at YWAM Field/Region Conferences:**

Purpose: build relationships between IDTSC and the DTS staff/leaders as well as helping to connect DTS staff and leaders in one geographical area or location to those in other areas/locations; collaborate with new initiatives coming come different schools; assess

the DTS needs of the Area/Region/Field; hold seminars in the context of the conference to begin to address some of the needs expressed; consult with the leaders regarding scheduling Foundational DTS Workshops or other DTS Leadership Training Seminars within the immediate 2 year time period; distribute available training resources to aid development;

1. ***Snapshot Report: Pan European Conference 2000*** 3 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team attended the conference and called together DTS Staff/Leaders from 17 European DTS Location in which there were 20 nationalities represented. A DTS Foundational Workshop was scheduled for July 2001.
2. ***Snapshot Report: South American Conference 2000*** 3 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team attended the conference and called together 30 DTS Staff/Leaders in the context of the conference.
3. ***Snapshot Report: Middle East Regional Conference 2001*** 2 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team attended the conference and called together 20 DTS Staff/Leaders in the context of the conference.  
A DTS Foundational Workshop was scheduled for January 2002.
4. ***Snapshot Report: European Leaders Forum 2001*** 3 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team joined the European Leaders Forum to discuss the development and interface of the IDTSC and the geographical structures of YWAM..
5. ***Snapshot Report: Central European Regional Conference 2001*** 3 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team attended the conference and scheduled a DTS Foundational Workshop for year 2002 .
6. ***Snapshot Report: West/Central India Reg. Conference 2001*** 3 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team went to network with DTS in the context of the Regional Conference & conduct seminars on topics desired by the attendees on current DTS issues. Input was solicited from all of the leaders, both geographical structures and DTS, on training needs. This resulted in the finalizing and scheduling of a DTS Leadership Training short course to be held for the DTSS of the Indian Subcontinent and Bangladesh in Nov/Dec. 2002. It will be called “Equipping Leaders Today” and lead by Elena Ciobo, and Ron/Bonny Theison plus others of the IDTSC and other leaders in India and Bangladesh in collaboration with Elizabeth and Steve Cochrane.
7. ***Snapshot Report: HUI - YWAM International Staff Conference 2001*** 6 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team attended the HUI for the purpose of connecting to the whole of YWAM in relationship, vision, prayer, teaching, and seeking God.
8. ***Snapshot Report: Pacific and Asia Field Conference 2001*** 4 of  
the IDTSC Leadership Team held a DTS training track in the context of the conference with about 50 participants for the purpose of building relationship, networking and needs

assessment. Two seminars were provided by Gwen Bergquist and Emele Kila to begin to address some of the needs presently. After consultation with the the DTS staff/leaders, 2 Foundational DTS Workshops were scheduled for the year 2002 to be lead by Patti Lee and others. Training resources were distributed at the time. In addition, there was significant networking with the geographical and ministry leaders in the Field throughout the whole time of the conference.

#### **D. Networking with YWAM Transnational Ministries**

**1. *Snapshot Report: Conference on Frontier Missions 2000* by Patti Lee** Networking and building relationships within the Frontier Missions context among the 150 participants attending the conference; sharing IDTSC developments and new initiatives; pursuing interfacing and collaboration with the field strategies of the Frontier Missions leaders and teams.

#### **E. Pioneering of YWAM Bases and Church Planting:**

**1. *Snapshot Report: Pioneering YWAM Kosovo 2001* by Martha McComb** All activities surround the ongoing, long term planting of YWAM in Kosovo under the leadership of Martha McComb, a member of the IDTSC Leadership Team based in Pristina, Kosovo.

a. Short term team recruitment and training of outreach leaders: We had four teams this winter Dec. 2000 - March 2001. Teams were from: Scotland (Seamill), Trinidad, Denmark and King's Lodge. They worked in four cities: Pristina, Decan, Prizren and Vushtri. The teams worked to help long term missionaries with new church plants, evangelism, discipleship, rebuilding widow's homes, etc.

b. Long Term Base Development: Developed our long term staff for YWAM Kosovo. Transitioned leadership to Jim and Kelly Baugh and Matt and Rachael Piercey. YWAM Kosovo set into it's second phase of development.

c. Staff Training Outreach: April - June 2001 Team of 8 people, purpose to train future DTS staff, model leading an outreach, study Muslim evangelism and put into practice what we learned. Over 4,000 people reached with the Gospel, 90 commitments to Christ.

## **II. Programme Development:**

**Curriculum Clarification Project:** Maureen and IDTSC Leadership Team

A. Why the need for Clarification:

1. Biblical Content poor DTSS
  - a. limited resource speakers available like in Africa or India.
  - b. neglect of certain topics (unknowingly) e.g. Father Heart of God covers God's

## Nature and Character.

- c. activities like Hearing God's voice, Intercession etc....are practiced less and less due to lack of understanding why. "Why pray? God is going to do what he wants anyway." Quote from a DTS staff
  - d. overemphasis on experience verses application of Biblical Truth.
  - e. a growing number of even western young people as well as young people from non-western cultures have little to no Biblical foundations (This is true of many who have grown up in the church..)
2. The need for more detail to help in Curriculum Design
    - a. overemphasis of some topics to the neglect of others
    - b. many schools simply duplicate the speaker topics of their own school
    - c. in the midst of the vagueness other voices set standards like "you must have one (or two) week of missions" or "you must have a week of Plumb line" or "you must have one week of openness and brokenness"
    - d. in the absence of qualified speakers staff would be able to cover basic principles through simple Bible Study and discussion.
  3. The need for DTS staff to be disciplined into the Biblical principles of the DTS.
    - a. many of our DTS staff have not had a sufficient DTS to equip them to lead a DTS for others.
    - b. thus the DTS continues to move further away from its intended quality and purpose. These written materials would help in the discipleship of DTS staff so they can disciple others.
  4. Many of the present DTS world do not understand the meaning behind cliché phrases like "the Fear of the Lord" or "the Character and Nature of God".
  5. The International DTS Centre is often asked to further explain the present vague DTS Curriculum statement. Without an agreed upon expanded document Centre members have no choice but to give their own opinion.
    - a. we do not want to create our own version of the DTS or mission. Instead we desire to represent the whole mission, with our wide spectrum of perspectives and callings.
    - b. every effort has been made to use language that is theologically inclusive.
    - c. every effort has been made to lay the Biblical foundations for all aspects of YWAM's ministry.
    - d. every effort WILL BE MADE to express the final draft in a way that is cultural sensitive and user friendly.
  6. The number of DTSs around the world as well as the high turnover rate in DTS necessitates the need for written materials to ensure the DTS stays on track.
    - a. the International DTS Centre will continue to build a network of people throughout the nations that provide a relational network that serves the DTS world. Written materials agreed upon by the GLT-ILT ensures this growing network stays true to the Missions expectations for DTS.

7. The proposed document does not dictate or restrict the DTS leader to a format or leadership style. It still allows for maximum flexibility but insured consistency and quality.

a. every effort has been made to identify individual components for the DTS rather than complete or partial models.

b. DTS leaders can emphasize certain relevant topics (without neglecting other areas).

c. DTS leaders can design their school in the way that suites the learning styles and cultures of their group.

B. An Explanation of the Proposed DTS Curriculum Document

1. 6 Curriculum Categories (not 7)

2. Each category has been expanded from a few short phrases to include

a. Integrated outcome statements (integration of “head, heart, hand” objectives)

b. Concepts to Understand and Apply (head)

c. Heart attitudes to nurture (heart)

d. Activities to do (hand)

3. Suggested Speaker topics and number of content hours (weeks)

4. Suggested Application formats (e.g. small group)

C. The process of writing the proposed clarification:

1. Prayer and discussion with Darlene, Patti and Maureen in 98 after which they decided to ask the GLT for the opportunity to work on clarifying the DTS Curriculum.

2. Maureen talked with Loren (Dec 98) and with Lynn Green (Aug 99) to get initial feedback on the idea and then proceeded with general discussion in the U of N ILT (Mar 99) and one on one discussion with various mission leaders to get more feedback on the idea. (July- November 99)

3. Statement made to the GLT regarding our intent to write up a proposal clarifying the DTS curriculum. (Darlene, Maureen Aug 99)

4. Initial rough draft on the Biblical principles as it relates to God and Man and Salvation written and sent to handful of mission leaders. ( Maureen chose people from different theological perspectives to see what kind of theological language people were comfortable with.)( Nov 99)

5. \*\*\*International DTS Center team gather in New Zealand for 8 weeks (Jan-Feb 2000) to write a rough draft of the clarified curriculum.

6. Rough draft discussed with various mission leaders for feedback. (March-Aug 2000)

7. Maureen continually edited rough draft (Apr-Aug 2000) as she receives feedback.

8. Ready for a more formal process of evaluation and editing in GLT (Aug 2000).

- F. YWAM GLT Process proposed and accepted in NZ 2000
1. All GLT members receive a copy of the Rough Draft of proposed DTS Curriculum upon arrival to GLT in New Zealand.
  2. Task Force appointed to meet during the GLT time frame in New Zealand to work on a final proposal of DTS Curriculum for the GLT.
  3. Task Force presents their conclusions to the GLT. Conclusions may include:
    - a. A final proposal for new DTS Purpose and Curriculum Statements (mandatory) Possibly a short version for publications (e.g. U of N catalogue) and a longer version for the use of DTS leaders.
    - b. (if necessary) A GLT endorsement of written materials to be used by the Int DTS Center to give direction to DTS world. (just short of mandatory)
    - c. A proposal to proceed to make the material more culturally sensitive and user friendly.

### III. Leadership Development:

A. Foundational Leadership Training Workshops: first level DTS staff and leadership training focused particularly on restoring and renewing the foundations of the DTS and including both personal and corporate spiritual renewal. Typically there are strong components of worship, prayer, impartation, the Word, personal ministry, intercession for nations and the calling forth of the destiny of the participants. A variety of topics are included in the context of the workshop such as the work of the Holy Spirit in discipleship, leadership principles, learning environments, presentation and discussion of the vision, values and ethos of the DTS, guidelines for DTS, general DTS curriculum material, curriculum design, and dealing with difficult issues etc. In the last several years particularly, God has been highlighting the “Apostolic Nature of DTS”. In addition to the above, one goal of the workshop throughout year 2000 and 2001 has been to introduce and familiarize DTS staff & leaders with the Draft copy of the clarified DTS Curriculum in preparation for the final copy to be approved by the GLT/ILT in August 2001 and subsequently distributed globally.

1. *Snapshot Report: DTS Workshop in the LTS January 2000* Most all of the IDTSC Leadership Team were present to direct the workshop in the field based LTS held in Auckland, New Zealand with a focus on the Pacific Region. There were 170



## RESULTS:

From December 1999 – December 2000, 17 DTS Outreach teams have served in the regions of Kosovo and Serbia. Each team has received orientation to the area, placed into a ministry location and given on-site training and oversight.

These DTS Teams have served four different existing churches and seven new church plants in Kosovo. They have also served two existing churches in Serbia and a church plant in Eastern Serbia. Two different DTS Teams have also served in a Community Development Project with a focus on Evangelism and an eventual Church Plant in the Vushtri Municipality in Kosovo.

In addition to DTS Outreach teams, we have also hosted other short term teams; 5:20 from YWAM Budapest, a team of pastors from YWAM Tyler, a Cords team from YWAM England and the MDM Team from the YWAM Intl. DTS Center.

Through the Short Term Teams we now have 12 full time YWAMers working with the YWAM Internet Café (The Cleft) and with the new YWAM Church Plant in Prizren. We have also seen students from previous outreach teams return to Kosovo leading teams of their own.

Through the training, equipping and releasing of these teams, we have seen 44 people make a profession of faith in Christ. This is significant considering that before the war there were only 82 believers and now there are 284 baptized believers in Kosovo.

Through concerts, Operation Christmas Child, English and Computer Classes, Bible studies, Street Outreaches, the Jesus Film, and numerous other outreach strategies, literally tens of thousands of people have heard the gospel for the first time in their lives.

Through our Outreach teams, the churches have been strengthened and have grown. YWAM teams are requested regularly by pastors and other missionaries. Our influence in the nation has grown significantly through this program and we are continuing to receive favor and open doors in Serbia and Kosovo.

DTS Outreach teams are receiving training and equipping in the area of evangelism, they are realizing their potential, and they are writing the spiritual history of a nation.

1. Biblical Studies Seminar \_ held annually for a 2-3 week period and lead by Maureen Menard and Patti Lee; content & location vary according to focus of study. The aim is to create a more personal and intense process for DTS leaders desiring to be mentored. All aspects of the study are directed to practical application in the participant's life and ministry in the DTS. The learning process involves directed inductive studies, individual study of the text with feedback in the group, and at relevant times lectures are

given by Maureen Menard (International DTS Center) and another visiting lecturer such as David Hamilton (International Associate Provost) Participants read materials provided and when available, explore the historical sites of the location relevant to the course of study at the time.

**a. *Snapshot Report: "Equipping Grace" 2001 by Maureen Menard*** 30 participants in Pathos, Cyprus for a Leadership Development seminar lead by Maureen Menard, David Hamilton and Patti Lee. The study was on Acts 1-15 and the book of Galatians. The time was focused on identifying leadership and discipleship principles at work in and through the life of Paul and integrating those principles into our own lives and ministries.

2. Focused Study Seminar \_ held annually in mobile locations with varied topics being considered.

**a. *Snapshot Report: 'World View 2000 based on the Character and Nature of God' by Darrow Miller***

3. Short Courses or Schools

**a. *Snapshot Report: 'Making Disciple Makers' (MDM) 2000*** The MDM is a DTS Leadership Training Building Block Course lead by Maureen Menard and others from the IDTSC which ran in Budapest, Hungary from April 25 - July 15. There were 21 DTS leaders and staff participating, including members of the International DTS Centre team. The course ran for 11 weeks. It included 5 wks of lecture in Budapest and 5 wks of outreach in two teams: one going to Kosovo and one going to Central Asia. It concluded with one week of debriefing.

MDM Outreach: One Outreach team went to Central Asia and was led by Aimee Honchen. The purpose was: to train DTS/outreach leaders, to connect young people and leaders to a region bursting with opportunities, to follow the Spirit of God, to pass on the heart and purpose of a DTS Outreach and to help DTS leaders break out of the box of what DTS outreach is/looks like.

MDM Outcomes: Participants left with a better understanding of the Biblical Foundations of the DTS, new ideas on how to design DTS, sharpened skills in leading outreach, and with new or strengthened friendships with others in the DTS world. Participants went on to effect DTS programs in 7 DTS programs (Lausanne, Amsterdam, Holmsted, Sarajevo, Budapest, Denmark and the Central Asian Mobile DTS.)

## II. Educational Resource Development:

**A. Snapshot Report: Central Asia CD 2000** This project was led by Erin Morales (Youth Ministry, Kona, Hawaii, USA) and overseen by (Aimee Honchen - IDTSC, Budapest, Hungary) and facilitated by Nancy Swabb (DTS Director, Amsterdam, Netherlands). The purpose was to create a resource tool for outreach teams going into Central Asia. The CD provides Central Asia ministry contacts, opportunities, vision, helpful info. etc. using live videos, slide shows and music.

## I. Strategic Multiplication

**A. Snapshot Report: Central Asia Mobile DTS 2001** Aimee Honchen, of the IDTSC Leadership Team, lead an International Mobile DTS which incorporated on the job, individual staff and leadership training in the context of this pioneering, apostolic ministry thrust into the strategic territories of Central Asia and the Turkic world. It's began and will end in Istanbul, Turkey and incorporates Almaty, Kazakstan as a key hub in Central Asia. The MDTS Outreach includes: Turkey, Armenia, Georgia, Azerbaijan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, and Kazakstan.

## **II. Future: Aspects of Development**
